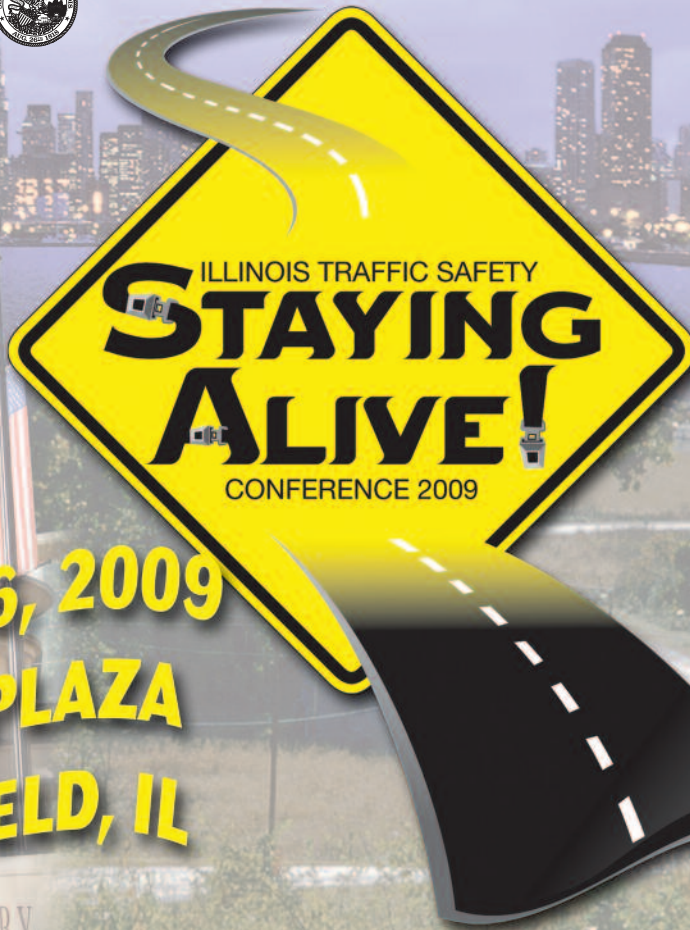

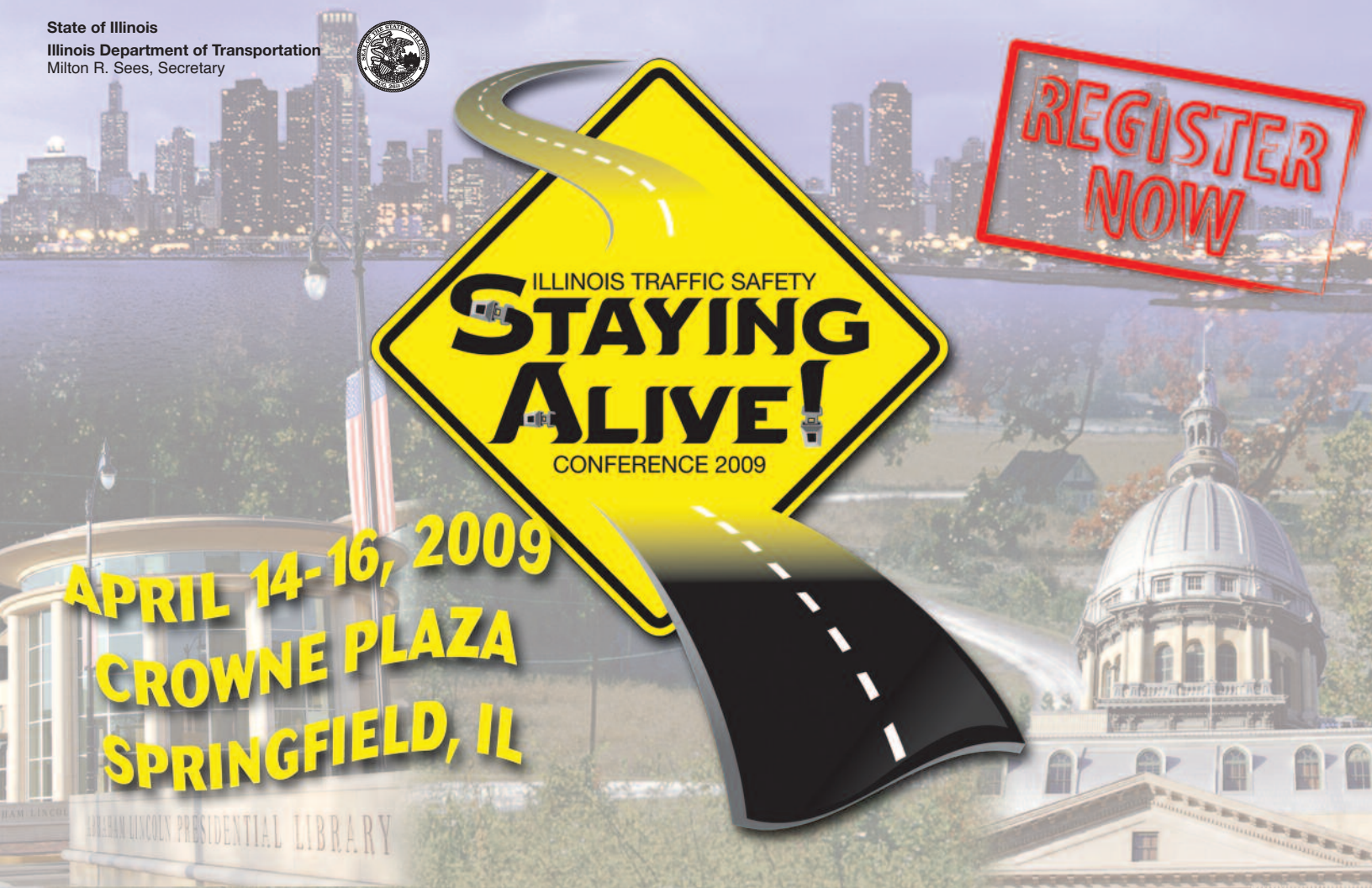

Michael Scagnelli

Chief of Transportation, New York Police Department

Chief Michael Scagnelli joined the New York City Police Department in 1970. He has distinguished himself in every rank, and has been assigned to a myriad of duties, including uniformed patrol, undercover narcotics and detective squad duties. He was commander of the 66 Precinct, the Motor Transport Division and the 12th Division. He has also served as the Executive Officer of Patrol Borough Brooklyn South and Manhattan South. Chief Scagnelli has also commanded the Traffic Control Division (which includes the Highway Patrol, Manhattan Traffic Task Force and the Parking Enforcement District).

Chief Scagnelli is currently the Chief of Transportation for the NYPD, and as such, administers Traffic Stat, an innovative program of accountability to improve the flow of traffic in New York City, while reducing traffic accidents, injuries and deaths. Chief Scagnelli is zealous regarding enforcement of serious traffic violations and is driven in his demands to arrest all drunk drivers.

Chief Scagnelli is a graduate of St. John's University and the Police Management Institute of Columbia University. The recipient of numerous awards of Departmental Recognition, Chief Scagnelli is the President of the Police Department's Honor Legion.
